

**January 9, 2018**  
**Greenwood Township –Regular Meeting Minutes**

The regular meeting of the Greenwood Township Board of Trustees was called to order by Supervisor Nowicki at 7:30 p.m. at the Greenwood Township Hall, 9025 Yale Road. Board members present Supervisor Nowicki, Treasurer Ramsey, Clerk O'Brien and Trustees Roberts and Krikorian. Also present were 7 residents, Zoning Administrator Jeff Kern and Bill Blumerich from St Clair County Road Commission. Nowicki added repairs to fire hall bathroom septic line as #3 to the agenda. Nowicki made a motion to approve the minutes of the previous meeting on December 12, 2017. Ramsey seconding. Motion carried 5-0.

In correspondence Nowicki discussed receiving correspondence from a company regarding web design, MTA regarding the capitol conference and a school of choice proclamation.

The treasurer's report was read by Ramsey and approved as presented.

Ramsey made a motion to approve the outstanding bills. Roberts seconding. Motion carried 5-0.

Nowicki discussed that Apollo has repaired Truck 36.

In the Zoning Administrator's Report there will be a Planning Commission meeting on January 17, 2018. Recommendations have been received from the Planner and the Township Attorney and will be discussed at the next Planning Commission meeting. Jeff Kern offered members of the Board to attend training regarding the Medical Marijuana law changes.

In citizen's comments Bill Blumerich from the St Clair County Road Commission was in attendance to answer any questions the Board or residents may have. A resident stated that the Road Commission does a great job keeping up with plowing after the snow.

In new business Nowicki made a motion for the custodian to get preapproval for ordering any supplies. Roberts seconding. Motion carried 5-0. O'Brien made a motion to approve the 4 applications for PA116 for Hulett. Ramsey seconding. Roll Call: Krikorian – yes; Nowicki – yes; Ramsey – yes; O'Brien – yes; Roberts – yes. Motion carried 5-0. Nowicki made a motion to have a company come out to the fire hall to clear blockage in the men's restroom. Roberts seconding. Motion carried 5-0. Nowicki made a motion to present a proposal to Kenockee Township for fire services. The proposal would be the current contract for 4 years adjusted by the CPI annually. Ramsey seconding. Motion carried 5-0.

In citizens comments residents had questions regarding the renewal of the Kenockee Fire Contract and the presence of the Planner and Township Attorney at the Planning Commission Public Hearing.

Nowicki made a motion adjourn. Ramsey seconding.
